



## **Calgary Police Service offer Safe Driving Seminar to Calgary Businesses**

Each year nearly 400 people are killed and more than 27,000 injured in vehicle collisions in Alberta. These collisions impact families, communities and businesses alike and cost Albertans \$4 billion annually. Sadly it is recognized that most of these collisions are preventable.

Alberta Human Resources and Employment cite motor vehicle collisions as the leading cause of on-the-job injuries and death in the province. Impaired driving and general bad driving habits are recognized as leading causes of these collisions. Bad driving habits translate to lost time, reduced productivity and increased safety and injury claim costs.

Bad driving impacts all of us but these effects can be offset by making a few simple changes. A proactive approach to driver education can not only reduce lost time at work and employer's potential liability, it can also reduce the heartache that goes along with such tragedies.

In an effort to enhance traffic safety, the Calgary Police Service - Traffic Education Unit is offering educational seminars for employers that would like to join with us and promote a safe driving culture.
